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### Call for Abstract for Simulation Expo 2019!

The Simulation Expo Planning Committee from the Simulation Training and Education Council Louisiana (SMTEC-LA) invites faculty, simulation operations specialist and others in the world of simulation to present their Simulation Research work in our 2019 SIM Expo Research Showcase. Abstracts from all Health Professions Schools, Disciplines, and Programs are welcome!

#### General Information/ Abstract Requirements:

All Abstracts are due by April 8, 2019 by 5:00 p.m.

Abstract should be no more than 300 words.

Accepted presenters will be notified by April 15, 2019.

Simulation Dissertations, Thesis, Clinical Research Projects, Proposals etc. [These include research, evidence-based practice, and quality improvement projects that are directly related to the practice of health care.

Other Scholarly Projects/Creative Work in the field of simulation [Projects that would not be defined specifically as research would fall into this category. Examples could include, but are not limited to, demonstrations of teaching innovations, literature reviews, or other works involving simulation.

Posters will be printed free of charge upon acceptance of the abstract. Specific criteria for poster will be disseminated upon acceptance of abstract.

#### Abstracts will be reviewed based on below guidelines. Abstracts submitted must have the following elements clearly stated:

**For Clinical Projects and Proposals Abstracts:** Question/Problem; Background; Aims; Methods; Results; Conclusions/Recommendations.

**For other Scholarly Project/Creative Work:** For any project not clearly fitting into the two previous categories provide a summary of the purpose and impact of the project/work.

Submissions may be individual, group work, or inter-professional collaboration.

The top scholar will receive an award for each category.

Participant will vote on posters.

All work will be displayed in a poster format with a designated time from presenters to remain near posters for questions.
